## **Alliant Educational Foundation's Regional** Children's Mental Health Consortium



By partnering with local non-profit organizations and the California School of Professional Psychology (CSPP) at Alliant International University, the Alliant Educational Foundation's Regional Children's Mental Health Consortium is providing mental health services to children, youth, and their families in under-resourced communities throughout San Diego and expanding to the San Francisco Bay Area in 2024.

The program places clinical psychology students in practicums to provide high-quality care to clients who need it the most, making a difference for some of our most vulnerable populations. Additionally, the program reduces the average cost of therapy sessions by 65% and funds licensed clinical psychologist supervisors most agencies cannot afford to staff on their own.

Last year, 70% of students treated in partnership with San Diego Unified School **District (SDUSD) showed** improvement in overall mental health functioning, while 75% showed decreased depression and 43% decreased their generalized anxiety disorder.

50% of all mental illness begins by age 14 and 75% begins by age 25.


Suicide is the 2<sup>nd</sup> leading cause of death among youth ages 10-24 in California.

Children/youth from underserved communities of color are more likely to experience mental health conditions due to discrimination, socioeconomic conditions, traumatic experiences, and barriers to quality mental health care.


About 70% of youth in the juvenile justice system have a mental health disorder


In working in community mental health,
